St. Luke continues to reach out to the online community to provide worship services to our homebound members, those who are out of town or traveling, and people who wish to find out more about us.


In addition to worship services, our Facebook feed provides reminders for the many activities and programs that St. Luke has to offer, updates for weather closings, and church-related news, so we invite you to *follow us* if you haven't already.

Currently, we have 499 followers with 611 people engaging in our posts. We have added a handful of followers and page "likes." Our posts have garnered 185 reactions, and we had 31 "shares." The more we share, like, and comment, the more reach we will get beyond the church walls.

In the past 90 days, St. Luke's Facebook page has reached 6,893 viewers. Over 60% of our audience is from the Amarillo area; however, we have reached as far as the Czech Republic, India, Brazil, Ghana, Ireland, Turkey, and Uganda!

- ◆ January 1 service—We experienced technical difficulties and were unable to stream the service. Fortunately, the problem was resolved by the next week. We have a very good track record thanks to many volunteers who work hard to get the service out there!
- January 8—141 people were reached, and 5 stayed to worship live; 15 reactions, comments, and shares.
- January 15—76 people saw the post, and 7 stayed to worship live; 7 reactions, comments, and shares.
- January 22—60 people were reached, and 7 stayed to worship live; 8 reaction, comments, and shares.

# Security Upgrades Starting

Things are happening! You may notice keypads near several doors that will be used to disarm the security system once we have the entire system installed. There have been quite a few wires pulled through the ceilings that lead to the closet in the library where all of the new system controls will be housed. IdeaCom has had some issues with getting wires to the new tower, because of the way it was built, but we are sure that they will come up with a solution in the near future. There is still quite a bit of work that will be done in January, and we do not have an idea of a completion date, but this is all very exciting, after such a long wait!

On the new door front, there have been some issues with damage that has occurred to the doors in shipping. The contractor is communicating with the supplier to try to get four undamaged doors within the timeframe needed. If gorillas continue to interfere, they plan to install the least damaged doors (they have scratches and dents but are functional) and then replace them with undamaged ones, once they finally arrive. So, don't be concerned if a new door is installed that looks a little subpar.

We will also be learning the new system, working on protocols and developing training for everyone who will be receiving a fob as a replacement for their current keys. That probably will not happen this month, so watch for our update in the March newsletter.
