MISSIONAL GRANT AWARDED

The Common Life Ministry Team recently announced the 2022 Missional Grants for Palo Duro Presbytery. St. Luke was awarded \$1,625 to be used for funding our Laundry Love project. We are truly thankful for the amount received and know that the families we serve each month will be extremely grateful.

Laundry Love is a national initiative whose objective is to provide opportunities to come together with people who are struggling financially and to aid them by paying for their laundry expenses. PER CAPITA MADE EASY

As a member of the General Assembly of the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.), our church annually pays an assessment to the national church which for 2023 will total \$9.85 per church member. For 2024, the per capita will decline slightly to \$9.80 per member.

Why do we pay this assessment known as per capita? Because we value our Presbyterian heritage and identity. As a congregation, we derive many material benefits from our Presbyterian association. At the General Assembly level, these include the oversight of preparation for ministers and the mechanisms for calling new ministers, the maintenance of the Presbyterian historical collection in Philadelphia, the biennial meeting of the General Assembly, resources ranging from training for ruling elders to assistance with immigration, and so much more.

Per capita goes to the General Assembly for the support of the whole denomination. In addition, our church helps support Palo Duro Presbytery, the group of PC(USA) churches roughly covering the Texas Panhandle. The work of the presbytery includes support and resources for clergy, lay pastors, and churches; Celebration Scholarships; youth programs such as Buffalo Gap and Youth Triennium; and support of a mission worker in Romania. The work of the presbytery is not funded by per capita, but by additional contributions from its member churches.

The Finance Committee is suggesting that each member pay their own per capita – that is, contribute \$9.85 right now to cover St. Luke's per capita for 2023. And since the presbytery does not receive any of the per capita, we are asking each member to go the extra mile and add a little to your additional contribution to send to Palo Duro. For example, instead of \$9.85, consider giving \$20.00 for the support of PC(USA) both nationally and regionally.

We look forward to your participation in per capita giving, an expression of your commitment to ministry both within our congregation and beyond.

ONLINE WORSHIP CONTINUES TO SERVE MANY

In the past 90 days, St. Luke's Facebook page has reached 7.9K, an increase of 34.7% from the 90 days prior. Our engagement in that time period was 1.4K (an increase of 66.1%).

- December 4 service—79 people were reached by the post, and 6 stayed to worship with us online; there were 13 reactions, comments, and shares.
- Christmas Pageant (December 7)—173 people were reached with 8 clicks to play; 26 reactions, comments, and shares.
- December 12-69 people saw the post, and 7 stayed to worship with us online; 10 reactions, comments, and shares.
- December 18—81 people were reached, and 9 stayed to worship with us live; 15 reactions, comments, and shares.
- Christmas Eve—110 people saw the post with 3 peak live viewers; 17 reactions, comments, and shares.
- December 25—87 people reached with 5 staying for worship; 23 reactions, comments, and shares.

It is worth noting that not all worshipers watch the service live. Many view the service at a later time or date.
