### St. Luke Seminar in September

**Dr. Anna Carter Florence**, the Peter Marshall Professor of Preaching at Columbia Theological Seminary and an ordained minister in the Presbyterian Church will lead our September seminar.

Looking for ways to breathe new life into your reading and interpretation of Scripture? In this workshop, Dr. Anna Carter Florence offers a fresh way to read Scripture in community—by entering it, encountering it, and coming back with something deep and true. What if we imagined ourselves as a repertory church, reading and rehearsing these biblical texts together, over time? What if Scripture was a text that needed to be practiced as well as studied? What if we learned to rehearse it until we find the script in the Scripture—our script? And what if people who fundamentally disagreed with one another could gather around Scripture in this way, and enjoy doing it? Maybe we could stop fighting about what the text means, and start listening to it, and one another—with real appreciation! Maybe we could find something true before we have to decide what's right.

Please join us Friday, September 22 from 7:00 p.m. - 9:00 p.m, and Saturday, September 23 from 9:00 a.m. - noon and 1:00 p.m. - 3:00 p.m. to discover some new strategies for reading Scripture that are easy to grasp and easy to adapt to any setting. We'll learn to "read the verbs" in a biblical text as we walk through it, together. We'll consider a host of helpful, often hilarious ways for a group to broaden its reading: questions to ask, techniques to try, and rules of fair play to keep things steady. Based on Anna's book, *Rehearsing Scripture: Discovering God's Word in Community*, this seminar will be a lively and energizing deep dive into Scripture.

### Christian Education

The adult Sunday School class will resume September 10 at 9:45 a.m. in the education wing classroom. This year, we will be exploring the Great Courses video series entitled, "The Apocryphal Jesus". **Cruse Messer** and **Kendra Jones** will facilitate the class. This series is presented by Prof. David Brakke, M.Div. from Harvard and Ph.D from Yale. The New Testament gives us 27 canonical texts—gospels, letters and more—but these works are only a tiny fraction of the many volumes written about the life of Jesus, his family, and the apostles. This alternative body of literature falls under the category

of "apocrypha," which means "hidden" or "secret," and it offers fascinating insights into the early Christian world and how different groups understood the teachings of Jesus and the apostles. All are welcome to join in viewing the videos, followed by lively discussion.

Children in grades K-5 are invited to join in a time of lessons and activities in the nursery classroom.
